VOTING FOR EQUITY

Equity is allocating resources and opportunities as needed (by sub-group, neighborhood, or marginalized group) to create equal outcomes throughout the country, state, county, city, or community.

Voting for equity means being aware of community needs and then meeting communities where they are aligned with their respective needs.

Check for candidates, ballot measures, and propositions that:

- Demonstrates value for all persons, identities, communities, and cultures
- Acknowledges that communities have different needs and that social oppression plays a role in the absence of needs being met
- Defends the rights of all people
- Seeks justice
- · Denounces hate and bigotry

VOTING FOR BELONGING



Keep belonging open by having conversations, offering mutual respect, and finding common ground.

Belonging is a sustained sense of attachment with and between people. When we feel like we belong, we feel accepted for who we are, connected even with those who are different than us, and engaged in a common goal and process of humanity.

Voting for belonging means maintaining that sense of humanity and also for rights to be maintained--rights to choice, freedom, and access.
